

Welcome to The Hide Safari Camp! We have carefully prepared this wildlife and fauna checklist to enhance and contribute to the enjoyment of your safari in this iconic wilderness area. Hwange National Park.

Hwange is Zimbabwe's largest National Park, covering approximately 14,600 Square Kilometers (about 5,700 square miles). There is over 500km of game viewing roads in the Park. About 60 permanent water sites, half of which are pumped and supply the non-seasonal water in Hwange. The vast majority of the Park is situated on Kalahari sand with Teak woodland being the predominant vegetation type. The ecosystems near to The Hide include elephant damaged scrub, Acacia woodland and open grassland. Only about 1% of the Park is open grassland.

Estimates for the populations of Hwange's four most common mammals are;

Elephant 30,000 Buffalo 10,000 Giraffe 6,000 Impala 5,000

Estimates of predator populations in Hwange include Lion at about 250 and killing approximately 8,000 animals per year. African (Painted) Wild Dogs at approximately 150 with over 7,000 prey items each year. Leopard at 60-100, killing about 3,000 animals a year.

## A few suggestions to make your safari more enjoyable:

- Please do not leave the immediate camp area unless you are accompanied by a guide. The camp is in a dangerous game area, so please do not compromise your safety.
- A list of suitable equipment for any game viewing activity includes, binoculars, camera/video, spare batteries, a hat/cap, sunscreen, insect repellent and this checklist.
- When preparing for a walking safari, please wear neutral coloured clothing (tan, brown, or green preferably), Try to avoid white as this is particularly visible.
- The vegetation in Hwange is adept at protecting itself from animals.

  Please be very careful of the thorns and watch where you put your feet.
- Leave nothing behind you but footprints.
- Take nothing with you but photographs and memories.
- Try to be as unobtrusive as possible. Animals are very aware of sudden movements and loud and excited voices. Try to keep your movements slow and your voice low and modulated when near animals.
- Although the days are warm, the nights may be unexpectedly chilly so
  please take something warm with you on the afternoon drives.
- Even night drives occasionally get opportunities for photographs so take your binoculars and camera with you.
- Your Guides are there to enhance the safari experience and will be happy to answer questions or assist you in any way possible.
