
TREES

Hwange National Park is home to the Big Five (Lion, Leopard, Rhinoceros, Elephant and Cape Buffalo) and is one of Africa's largest elephant sanctuaries. Over 100 mammal species, more than 400 bird species and countless smaller creatures occur here. At least 1000 floral species have been identified including 230 different trees and shrubs and almost 200 grasses. The abundance of flora and fauna makes Hwange National Park one of the most diverse parks in the world. This is a checklist of species you may be fortunate enough to see.

Friends of Hwange Trust (FOH) works to conserve not just the elephants, but all wild fauna and flora in the National Park. This work is undertaken in close collaboration with the National Park's Authority.


